


How to Be a Happy Christian

The Gospel Presentation Made Easy

Paying It Forward Till He Comes



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Introduction

After having read the comments below you will have a deeper understanding of why memorizing the gospel presentation and sharing it with others is so important. Our salvation is all about knowing Jesus and what He has done in each of our lives and then sharing it with others. True happiness comes by sharing what Jesus has done in our lives. It should be understood however that God does not need you or I to complete the work of sharing the gospel to all the world. God's amazing love however constrains Him to involve us in the saving of lost humanity and in so doing secure our own salvation and that of many others.

I hope that after having read the comments below, that you will be so inspired as to join one of our classes in learning the gospel presentation and then use it to save a lost soul. It may even be your own.

1. A Happy Church Is A Growing Church.

- a. "A happy church is a growing church."
- b. Growth is a by-product of a happy church.
- c. When you have a church that is happy in Jesus, joyful in Jesus, that church is going to grow.
- d. There is absolutely no question that your church will grow if you do the above.

2. Being happy draws people to Jesus.

- a. As a Christian, it is our purpose to be happy in Jesus.
- b. You say, aren't all Christians happy?
- c. The answer is no, because Christianity can become just a religion, and a religion doesn't necessarily make you happy.
- d. But being a follower of Christ however will make you happy.

- e. And if you have a relationship with Jesus, and are a follower of Jesus you will be happy.

3. Doing things does not make you happy.

- a. Just doing Christian things does not make you happy either.
- b. If you are part of a church that does this on this day, and that on that day, this does not make you happy.
- c. And you can have a whole ritual of life that would be called Christian, but that does not mean you know Christ.
- d. The Bible also says that in the last days people will say to Jesus Math 7: 21-23: Lord did we not do this and did we not do that in your name, and He will say I never knew you. Depart from me ye that practice iniquity.

4. Knowing Jesus and sharing Him, makes us happy.

- a. You will never find an unhappy or sad soul winner. Show me a person who is sharing Jesus with people and who is successful in winning people to Christ and I will show you a happy Christian. The two naturally go together.
- b. When you are sharing your love of Jesus with people and seeing the Lord work in and through you to bring people to Christ, and those people become your friends and members of the church and followers of Christ, you can't help but be a happy Christian.
- c. When you see that happen on a regular basis, it has an automatic joyful effect upon your life and joy just fills your heart.

5. Assurance of salvation also makes us happy Christians.

- a. To be truly happy we need to have the assurance of salvation, but that only happens as we get to know Jesus.

- b. Therefore our first task is to know Jesus and have a personal relationship with Him so we can become a happy Christian and then share Him with others.
- c. And the more we share Him with others the happier we will be and the more assured of our salvation.

6. Three-legged milk stool.

- a. It's kind of like the 3-legged milk stool, which must have 3 legs to remain stable and not fall over.
- b. We too must have 3 legs, to remain strong and stable in our walk with Jesus, and these three legs are **(1)** bible study **(2)** prayer, and **(3)** sharing the gospel.
- c. Without these three elements we get stuck in our Christian walk and don't grow spiritually.
- d. Therefore nobody is happy when they are stuck.

7. Don't get stuck and stink like the Dead Sea.

- a. Nobody is happy when they are stuck off road in their 4 by 4.
- b. It makes for a very unhappy experience.
- c. It is no different in our spiritual journey, when we are not sharing the gospel.
- d. We are unhappy Christians, and begin to stink, just like the Dead Sea, which keeps on receiving and receiving, but with nothing ever flowing out.
- e. But when we: **(A)** become what Jesus wants us to be, **(B)** do what Jesus wants us to do, and **(C)** go where Jesus wants us to go, we are a happy Christian.
- f. And remember, it is hard, especially if you are a shy and introverted person, but don't let fear prevent you from memorizing the gospel presentation, there are souls that depend on you.

8. 10% will give their life to Jesus, and 86% will come to church if asked by a friend they know and trust.

- a. How amazing it would be to have a church full of people sharing Jesus.
- b. All churches would grow if the mission of the church was such that everyone was thinking whom could I find this week, to share the gospel with.
- c. Who among the 22,000 people living in our area can I share Jesus with?
- d. Kevin says that 10% of the people where you live are ready to give their life to Jesus if invited by someone they know and trusted, and another 86% would come to church if invited by someone they know and trusted.
- e. So in North Saanich and Sidney alone, 2,200 people are ready to give their lives to Jesus, and another 18,920 people would go to church if invited by someone that they know and trust.
- f. Did you catch the common thread, it has to be “someone they know and trusted.”

9. The gospel to the entire world in 8 hours

- a. If every Christian in the world would share the gospel with just one other person, and then that person shared the gospel with just one more person, and then the first person shared with just one more person, the whole world would hear the gospel story in just 8 hours.

10. Sharing Ideas is not sharing the gospel.

- a. And remember sharing the gospel is different then sharing ideas.
- b. If you are sharing the gospel, it is not the same as sharing some new theology, debating whether the 144 thousand is literal or

symbolic, or expounding your position for or against women's ordination.

- c. There are some people however, that are always looking for some theological thing to debate, but that is not sharing your faith. Sharing your faith is when you talk about Jesus, what He means to you, that He is your Lord and Saviour.
- d. It is sharing with people how to know Jesus as your personal Lord and Saviour.
- e. Sharing and debating ideas is actually an impediment to sharing the gospel.
- f. People are not drawn to a church that is in turmoil over this thing or that thing.

11. People Pastor Kevin has shared the gospel with.

- a. Kevin says he has shared the gospel presentation with pastors, pastor's wives, and in a couple cases administrators, colporters, and even church leaders.
- b. So if you memorize the gospel presentation and adjust it to fit the person, and as the spirit leads, and that person gives their life to the Lord, you will be a happy Christian.

12. Lost souls in the pews of our church.

- a. How can you remain silent and just hope that someone else does it for you?
- b. There are lost people even in the pews of our church every Sabbath and they need you to share Jesus' love with them.
- c. If you don't share the gospel with those people who will?
- d. Our pastor can't get to everybody; you may be the only one that can resonate with that person, so God needs your unique personality to connect with that person and lead them to Christ.
- e. "Who else will do it if you and I don't?"

The following true story is reason enough for us to be ready at all times to share the gospel presentation. We never know when those moments present themselves and we should be ever ready when they do. As this story suggests, we might be the only one that can.

Story of Lady in the Hospice

Pastor Kevin now tells the story of Bill, a young male nurse in his congregation, who worked in a hospice and was taking care of a woman who was terrified of dying. He came to Kevin and asked, "Do I need to teach her about being an Adventist or should I teach her about the state of dead?" And Kevin said, "No, you need to teach her about the state of the living." Bill said, "What do you mean? Kevin answered, "She needs to receive the gift of salvation, have you ever presented the gospel to someone?"

It Had To Be Bill.

Now here is a perfect example of why we need to know how to give the gospel presentation. There was no way that, she was going to let Kevin be by her bedside, she was terrified of the church and pastors. If anyone was going to lead her to Christ, it was not going to be the unbelieving nurses in that hospital. It was not going to be the unbelieving doctors in that hospital. She didn't have family, so who was going to lead her to Christ? It had to be Bill. And you are in that same boat, there are lots of people that you know, and nobody else is going to tell them the gospel. It has to be you.

And Bill said, "I don't know how."

And Bill said, "I don't know how." Kevin answered, "I can teach you in 30 minutes." And they sat down and Bill started taking notes. And when Bill was finished taking notes, Pastor Kevin said, "You need to practice. I want you to tell me what I just told you." And Bill looked at Kevin with the fear of a deer looking

into a car's headlights. Bill was so nervous. So, Kevin coached Bill, and it took a little while, but finally he could get through the whole thing. And Bill said, "OK pastor, I'll do the best I can."

Bill Shares The Gospel With Her.

So, on Monday Bill went back to her room, he sat beside her on her bed; and she look at him and said, "I'm so afraid." Bill took her hand and said, "I have something to share with you that I think might help." And she said, "Oh please." And Bill shared with her all the steps of the gospel presentation and when he got to the place where he said, "Is there any reason why you would not want to accept Jesus as your personal Saviour." And she said, "No there is no reason I would not want to do that." And so, Bill led her through the prayer. She repeated the prayer after him, and when she said Amen, she laid her head back on her pillow and her entire body relaxed and she said, "I'm not afraid to die now, I know that I have Jesus." And the tears rolled down her cheeks, and the tears rolled down Bill's also, as he continued to hold her hand. And Bill told Kevin, "Pastor, I can't wait to do that again."

13. A Crisis, the tipping point.

- a. The question still remains, and I know you are now thinking.
"How do I find people to share the gospel with?"
- b. "When will I know the right time to give the gospel presentation."
- c. All the studies and surveys suggest that the tipping point in a person's life for that to happen is a crisis.
- d. People are vulnerable to the Spirit of God in times of crisis.
- e. Be always looking and listening for someone to say, "I've got to go to the doctor, that might be all that they say. That's a crisis, and they are worried.
- f. Or someone says, "I'm having marriage problems," that's a crisis. That is a bell ringing, that's a person in pain that you need to get to know better and help.

14. Give them a gift you either made or bought.

- a. So how do you do that? Let's say that you work with them, but are not close enough to them to have a personal conversation, but you can give them something that you have made, and say, "I'm thinking about you, and then walk away."
- b. And if you are not the type of person that makes stuff, buy them a small gift.

15. Be a good listener.

- a. Just be a good listener, say, "I don't know if you want to talk about it, but if you do, I'm willing to listen."
- b. More times than not they will talk about it.
- c. More than likely they will talk to you before anyone else.

16. Borrow a cup of flour.

- a. If you have to, go borrow a cup of flour, even if you've got flour in the cupboard.
- b. Do whatever you need to do to develop a relationship with that hurting person.
- c. This gives them a chance to get acquainted with you.

17. Live Case Study: Steps to the gospel presentation.

- a. Kevin is currently talking to a person in a crisis, who is not a member of his church, but he knows that person well enough so that he is able to confide in him.
- b. Kevin phones him from time to time, and says, "How are you doing?"
- c. And his friend will share his current concern, and then Kevin says, "I'm praying for you."

- d. And his friend says, "Thank you so much." And occasionally he phones Kevin and they will talk at length.
- e. Their relationship over the months keeps growing.
- f. This began when Kevin's friend simply made a comment and Kevin said he would listen.
- g. Don't offer advice at the beginning, you just simply listen. But when they ask, "What would you do in this situation."
- h. You just tell them what you would do if it were you.
- i. But the big question is how will you know when to share the gospel presentation.

18. When is he right time?

- a. Kevin tells of his son who was in such a quandary about how he would know when he found the right girl to marry.
- b. He came home one time from college very frustrated and said dad, I don't think there is any girls out there at all."
- c. And Kevin said, "Yes there is."
- d. And he said, "How do you know dad when you have found the right one?" Kevin said, "You'll know."
- e. His son said, "Come on dad how will you know."
- f. And Kevin said, "That's impossible to answer. You can't give a person a check list, when you know, you know."
- g. And his son was kind of frustrated, by that answer.
- h. But eventually he met the right girl, she's a Canadian, they live in Kelowna, and they have been married happily ever after.

19. One day you will know.

- a. So, when the Holy Spirit is moving on this person and you are doing everything to be acquainted and listening to them and being their friend, one day you will know when it is the right time.
- b. It will be as clear as a bell when you need to say something.

The following story will totally amaze and set your heart on fire to save a soul. What I am sharing in this manual is not just some old class, of instructions, but an amazing story of how the grace of God can transform the human heart. Read Jerry's story and then follow it up by sharing the gospel presentation to someone that has no assurance of salvation.

Jerry's Story

Kevin tells the story of Jerry a gun collector who was going to commit suicide by opening his mouth and pulling the trigger of his favourite revolver. First, Jerry wanted to visit a friend before he left this world but when he got to his friend's house he was not there, and Jerry thought to himself "Isn't that fitting." But on his way back home he passed by the Adventist church, and for some reason, he didn't know why, (but we do) he turned in to the church. The church school was by the church and the schoolteacher was just leaving for the day. Jerry was such a scary looking guy that he scared the teacher, but she asked him if he wanted to see the pastor and he said yes. The schoolteacher then wrote out Kevin's phone number and gave it to him.

Jerry Falls So Low He Phones Kevin.

When Jerry got home he phoned Kevin and said, "I need to talk to somebody right now." So, Kevin said, "I'll be right there," but he called up an elder because he didn't know what he was getting into. And when they got there, they went in and sat down in Gerry's living room in his tiny little trailer and Jerry told Kevin, "I can't believe that I have fallen so low as to have a pastor in my home." And Kevin looked at him and he said, "Jerry why do you feel that way?"

Nothing in life worth living for.

He said, "You know, I've been an iron worker all of my life. You know, those iron bridges in Portland, Oregon, I helped build every one of them. I'm the guy that walks out on the steel beam and when they bring up another one, I spot weld it in

place, I'm not afraid of anything." And he said, "I made it my purpose in life, to drive every Christian off the job site. If I found out that there was a Christian on the job site, I would heckle them, persecute them, do everything that I could possible do, to get them off the job because I hate Christians." And he said, "I have come to the place in my life where I have tried everything, there is no joy or hope or good, or enjoyment in anything, in this world." And he made a long list of all of the stuff that he had tried. And he said, "And now I have a pastor in my living room." And Kevin turned to him and he said, "Gerry, you have tried everything, haven't you?" And Gerry said, "Yes." And Kevin said, "But you haven't tried Jesus." And Gerry said, "Is He a real person?" Kevin replied, "Yes absolutely, absolutely." And Gerry answered, "How so?"

The gospel presentation transforms Jerry.

And Kevin said, "May I share with you how I came to know Jesus?" And Gerry said, "Sure." And when Kevin got to the place where he finished his testimony, he said to him, "Jerry you have tried everything, is there any reason why you wouldn't give Jesus a try?" (When you know the presentation well enough you can adjust it to fit the person you are talking too.) And Gerry said, "No there is no reason why." Then Kevin replied, "Do you feel comfortable, praying out loud and asking Jesus to forgive your sins and be your Saviour? And Gerry said, "No, I've never prayed, I don't know what to say." So, Kevin said, "Would you feel comfortable repeating a prayer after me?" Jerry said, "Yes." So, they knelt and Kevin led Jerry in prayer, and this tough guy, as they were going through the prayer, halted in his speech at several places, expressing his sinfulness, asking God to forgive his sins, something was happening. When they came to the place where they asked Jesus to come into his heart, and choose Jesus to be his Saviour, he suddenly grabs Kevin's arm, while still praying.

The Devil Leaves Through The Ceiling.

And he says, "Did you see that." And Kevin says, "See what?" And Gerry says, "You are not going to believe me." Then Kevin says, "Try me." And Gerry says,

“You had your head bowed and your eyes closed, but I was looking toward heaven where God is. Suddenly, I felt something leave my body. I felt it leave my body and I saw, an evil looking man-like being, above me, and suddenly, when I said, I wanted Jesus to be my Saviour and Lord, he looked angrily at me and left through the ceiling, what was that?” Kevin said, “Didn’t you say, that you were trying to commit suicide today. That was the evil spirit that was trying to get you to take your life, and when you accepted Jesus as your Saviour, that evil spirit had to go.”

Jerry Feels Really Good.

And a look of wonderment came across Jerry’s face and he says, “I’ve never felt this before, what is this? And Kevin asked Jerry, “What are you feeling?” And Jerry said, “I feel good. I feel really good. I feel happy for the first time in my life. I have never felt happy like this in my entire life. What is that?” Kevin said, “Didn’t you just ask Jesus to come into your life?” Jerry said, “Yes.” “Did you mean it?” said Kevin. Jerry said, “I tried too.” Well that’s Jesus,” said Kevin. Jerry said, “I like that very much.” They then finished the prayer, stood up, and Kevin welcomed Jerry to the family of God. And said, “Your sins are not forgiven, according to the bible. Your name is written in the book of life. Jesus is now living in your heart. You are a fellow Christian.”

The New Jerry Collects His Stuff To Bury.

And Jerry shook Kevin’s hand firmly, and he said, “I really appreciate you coming to my home, will you come back?” And Kevin said, “Yes I would like to study the bible with you. How about Wednesday?” “That would be great.” Kevin said, “Do you have a bible?” Gerry said, “No, I do not have a bible.” A few days later, Kevin brought him a bible and Gerry invites him in again and they sat down at the kitchen table and Jerry points out the window to his orchard. “Do you see that little tree over there?” Kevin says, “Yes.” I just planted that tree yesterday. ”Kevin answers, “What kind of tree is it?” “It’s an apple tree.” “That’s awesome,” Kevin

says. And Jerry says, “You don’t know why.” Kevin says, “Why did you plant the apple tree?” “After you left I didn’t sleep all night. I was so happy I couldn’t believe how happy I was. I felt like I was a new person. I started walking through the house; I started talking to God. Suddenly I saw something and something inside said you don’t need that any more.” And I said, “Ya, I don’t need that stuff. I collected it and put it by the front door, so I could put it in the garbage. And I was so happy; I just kept going through my house. I went through every room in my house and I found a lot of stuff, that I don’t want any more. I emptied out my booze, and placed the emptied bottles by the door. I put all my marijuana and other drugs by the door. I put all my pornography by the door.”

Burying The Old Jerry.

“And after I made this big pile of stuff I thought what am I going to do with that stuff. And I got the thought, I need to bury it. So I went out with my shovel in the middle of the night, so here I am digging this hole in the middle of the night, I was so happy that I just kept digging. So, after I had dug for a while, I thought, how deep do I need to dig this hole?” And then Jerry said, “The thought occurred to me, that a grave is 6 feet deep, I’m going to dig a 6-foot hole.” And so, he kept digging until he got a 6-foot hole. And then he put everything in a bag and dropped it in the hole. And then it suddenly hit him that he was burying the old Jerry. “I’m having a funeral; I’m burying the old Jerry, he said.” So, he started covering it up, and then another thought occurred to him, “That isn’t good enough, I’m a new person.”

Planting The Apple Tree.

So, he waited until morning and went to the nursery and bought an apple tree and came home and planted the apple tree right on top of the old Jerry, and he prayed and thanked God, for what He had done for him. And he told Kevin, “That’s where it’s all buried, underneath that tree.”

20. Not Just Another Soul Winning Strategy

- a. Kevin says, “Sharing the gospel presentation, might seem like just another soul winning strategy, something that you would learn in any old class, but it’s not.” It is the opportunity for someone to give his or her heart to Jesus.
- b. It could be your children, your grandchildren, it could be a loved one a family member, a dear friend.
- c. By following this plan you will see people give their lives to the Lord and you will be astonished.

21. The Happiest Day of Your Life.

- a. “And when that person that you have led to Jesus starts coming to church with you, and then gets baptized, there are no words for that.”
- b. And Kevin goes on to say, “I don’t even know how to describe that to you, that will be the happiest day of your life.
- c. And you will be so addicted to this, that you will be saying, where can I find another person that I can share Jesus with.”

22. The Challenge: Make 2018 The Year of Jesus’ Return

- a. This is the joy that the apostles had, and why the gospel spread throughout the then known world in the first Century after Christ.
- b. I want to ask you the question. “Why not make it your joy by having Jesus come in the 21st century, or even better, why not make 2018 the year of Christ’s return?”

It is best if the gospel presentation is memorized, but if that is not possible have it well enough in mind so that it includes all of the necessary elements and so you can change it up to suit the individual person that you are sharing it with.

The Gospel Presentation In 14 Easy Steps

1. You: Have you come to the place where you have the assurance of your salvation? Or (accepted Jesus as your personal Saviour?)

2. They: No I haven't.

a. (If they say I think so, or I'm trying it's a no.)

3. You: May I share with you how I have come to know Jesus as my Saviour and have the assurance of eternal life?

4. They: Please do.

5. You: (Personal Testimony) I discovered in my life that I did not have the power necessary to make things better. It seemed things kept getting worse and worse, and I was unable to fix them, and worse than that, when I die that would be the end of all things, with nothing beyond this life to look forward to. It was then that I found that the bible says in **(1. Everyone Needs Jesus)** Romans 3:10 23. There is no hope without Jesus, because "there is none righteous and all have sinned." And even when I try, I fall short, but the good news is that Jesus came into this world and offered me not only eternal life, but also help and victory in this life as well. And then I found it says in **(2. Eternal Life Is A Gift In Jesus)** Romans 6:23 that Jesus offers me "the gift of God, which is eternal life," and He will give me victory in my every day struggles. And it also says in **(3. Eternal Life Comes When We Receive Jesus)** John 3:16 "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life." And I found that it also says in **(4. Pray & Ask Jesus Into Our Life)** Revelation 3:20 that He is standing at the door knocking, and if anyone hears His voice and opens the door, He "will come into him and dine with him." And all I must do is but pray and ask Him to come into my life, like He promised. So, I prayed to Him that I want to be what You want me to be, I want to do what you want me to do, I want to go where you want me to go, and Jesus came into my heart. And I now feel at peace and have the assurance of salvation, because Jesus came into my heart, and forgave my sins. (About one minute long)

6. You: Is there any reason why you wouldn't want to accept Jesus as your Saviour?

a. (10% of the people in your community want someone they know & trust to ask them this question today. And 86% would also come to church if invited by a friend they know & trust.)

7. They: No, there isn't.

8. You: Are you comfortable praying and inviting Jesus to be your Saviour?

9. They: I don't know how. (98% of the time)

10. You: Then would you be comfortable in repeating a prayer after me?

11. They: Yes.

12. They: Dear Father in Heaven, thank you for your love for me. I know I am a sinner, but You have said that You want to forgive my sins. Please forgive me for all my sins, and I thank You because You have promised that You would. Today I choose Jesus as my Lord and Saviour. Please give me the gift of eternal life, and I thank You that now I have eternal life because of your death and resurrection. Now help me to live in such a way that I may be a blessing to anyone I can. In Jesus' name, Amen

a. (Some people aren't with Christ and they don't want Christ. And when you ask them they will be very firm about it. When that happens say, "I just wanted to help you as best I can, but I will respect your wishes." Then drop it at that. When somebody says no, it's no. Honour their wishes, but don't stop being their friend. Just don't go where they don't want you to go, but continue to minister and be their friend. However, that almost never, ever happens. Most people understand your motive; they understand you and they are very receptive to what you are saying.)

13. You: "Welcome to the family of God. According to the bible, your sins are now forgiven. According to the bible you have eternal life, Jesus is now in your heart and your name is written in the book of life. You are now a fellow Christian."

a. (You have just acknowledged and confirmed that their sins are forgiven and that they have eternal life. You do that on the authority of the scripture. So, shake their hand or give them a hug depending on what is appropriate.)

14. You: What would be a good time next week to learn more about the wonderful love of Jesus?

a. (Kevin has had people shout, "Praise the Lord." Some people have tears in their eyes. Some a look of awe and wonder on their face, but in every case, there is a transformation that takes place, when that person opens their heart to Jesus, and Jesus comes into their heart.)

The following section contains the texts to be used in your personal testimony. Each of the 4 parts should be included in your personal testimony with at least some of the supporting texts.

1. Everyone needs Jesus (Memorize these 4 steps and share.)

- a. Romans 3:10 There is none righteous, no, not one.
- b. Romans 3:23 For all have sinned & come short of the glory of God.
- c. Romans 6:23 For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Jesus our Lord.
- d. Jeremiah 13:23 Can the Ethiopian change his skin or the leopard its spots? Then may you also do good who are accustomed to do evil.

2. Eternal Life is a Gift in Jesus

- a. Romans 6:23 (Last part) but the gift of God is eternal life.
- b. Ephesians 2:8,9 For by grace you have been saved through faith, and not of yourselves. It is a gift, not God, not of works lest anyone should boast.
- c. John 3:16 For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life.
- d. John 6:37 All that the Father gives Me will come to Me, and the one who comes to Me I will by no means cast out.

3. Eternal Life Comes From Accepting Jesus

- a. Revelation 3:20 Behold I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears My voice and opens the door, I will come in to him and dine with him, and he with Me.
- b. 1 John 5: 11-13 And this is the testimony: that God has given of His Son. And this is the testimony: that God has given us eternal life, and this life is in His Son. He who has the Son has life; he who does not have the Son of God does not have life.
- c. John 10:10 The thief does not come except to steal, and to kill, and to destroy. I have come that they may have life, and that they may have it more abundantly.

- d. John 5:24 Most assuredly, I say to you, he who hears My word and believes in Him who sent Me has everlasting life, and shall not come into judgment, but has passed from death into life.
- 4. Pray and Accept Jesus Into Our Life (No Scripture for step 4)**
- a. Is there any reason, why you wouldn't want to accept Jesus as your Lord and Saviour, (into your life)? (10% of the people in your community want to be asked this question. And another 86% will go to church if invited by someone they know.)
